

On All Saints Eve, October 31, 1517, Martin Luther tacked a list of 95 theses as topics for debate onto the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. That simple act served as a major catalyst for the Reformation, which we continue to celebrate and give thanks for to this day.

Our Reformation Service will be on Sunday, October 26.





In our Sunday "Divine Service" there is a continuing miracle. Almighty God, Creator of Heaven and earth stoops to serve us sinners. Our Risen Savior has taught us to expect His own Presence-- especially where two or three gather in His name, and focusing in His Supper. Along with God the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus promised would come as our Helper when Jesus would no longer be visibly present-- especially as the Gospel is present for us in all its forms, making of it the power of our salvation.

Word and Sacrament are earthly vessels that God has chosen for His instruments. So easily ignored and despised, much like the person of Jesus Himself-- God born in animal's stable and put to death on a criminal's bloody cross. Yet there God worked His greatest miracle of all. Salvation was now possible for every sinner in this fallen world!

God has done it all-- once for all. We have no need to offer some sort of sacrifice. Still worship also involves what we call our "sacrifice" of heart-felt thanks and praise, together in communion with other believers present and those who have gone before us and the angels and archangels themselves around the heavenly throne of God.

The sobering fact is that God has no need of our praise. Yet it brings joy to the kingdom of heaven. It is our recognition that what God has done is truly for usthe sign that we have received and opened the divine gift by faith. Such praise and thanks is itself a wonderful key to open a full life for ourselves. For example, it is not possible to allow ourselves to be weighed down by heavy worries and at the same time be thanking and praising the God who is greater than all the worries in the world and who cares for us far beyond our ability ever fully to grasp.

As a pastor, an easily ignored, fellow-sinner-- yet servant of Christ-- I urge you not to miss out on what our almighty, caring God would do for you! And on what you will do for others by your presence as a member of Christ's own body.




