My home is next door to the church in the parsonage. So I hear the tower bells sounding the hours along with a hymn-- and even more music on Sunday morning, the Day of Resurrection.



I have been walking laps around the church during this time when we are to shelter at home, and on this day when I am writing I was right under the bells when they started to ring.

It brought to mind the words of the hymn "Built on the Rock."

1. Built on the Rock the Church shall stand Even when steeples are falling.
Crumbled have spires in every land;
Bells still are chiming and calling,

Longing for life everlasting.

The hymn also reminds us that the building is NOT the Church. The Church carries on when buildings cannot be used for gatherings, as difficult as that is for us.

The Rock upon which the Church is built is Jesus Christ. That He is the Rock, the solid foundation upon which the Church is built, is an Easter Theme.

"The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." - Psalm 118:22

That verse is quoted by Jesus as referring to Himself in Matthew 21:42 as He was being rejected by the Jewish leaders. And He promised this about His Church:

"The gates of hell shall not prevail against it." - Matthew 16:18

Treasurer's Report April 2020

Where does the time go? Brenda and I have missed all of you while we spent our last two months on winter vacation in sunny, warm Florida. Meanwhile many events have taken place in all of our lives. On February 9th, you celebrated Pastor's 50th anniversary as a pastor followed by a great celebratory luncheon. Following this event, Immanuel had a service for Second Wednesday of Lent which was the last service before the lockdown due to COVID-19. We all look forward to again being able to worship together at Immanuel which now looks to be delayed until, at best, May 3rd.

Finances

Here are some financial highlights for the first three months of 2020:

Monthly Income Need $$11,185 \times 3 \text{ months} = $33,555$

Actual Income Received \$11,916 – January Expenses - \$13,231

\$10,077 – February Expenses - \$10,603 \$ 9,284 – March Expenses - \$10,128

Due to fewer contributions in February and anticipating lesser contributions in March due to the COVID-19 lock-down in mid-March, I elected to make an emergency transfer of \$5,000 from Immanuel's LCEF Savings Account to our bank checking account.

Perhaps this transfer may not have been necessary as Immanuel would have otherwise had a Balance Forward of \$4,134 at the end of March. However, it now appears the transfer was financially prudent in light of the lock-down continuing through April and bills will continue to arrive. Immanuel's known expenses to date for April total \$7,000.

Some of our members and friends have inquired of Pastor how they could mail contributions to Immanuel since the church would not be open and would there be someone to handle the checks. Yes, our mail is taken in each day and frequent deposits will continue to be made.

We do have some members who automatically direct contributions to Immanuel from their bank that are delivered to Immanuel via mail. So contributions can be safely mailed to Immanuel. Hopefully this addresses concerns of sending contributions during the continued governmental lockdown. In the meantime, Pastor and I are working with LCEF on a resource to consider for making contributions as you wish called Joyful Response. We should have more information on this in the near future.

I pray that each and every one of our people remain healthy and safe from COVID-19 until we can safely meet again.

While Immanuel will not be able to hold our Easter service on April 12th, have no fear. Immanuel WILL have an Easter service and an Easter Breakfast at a time when it will be prudent and safe for all of us to meet again.

I look forward to seeing each and every one of you, so pray that this COVID-19 is overcome soon and to never return

Let me leave with this thought for you to contemplate:

Some people say, "Give until it hurts." But God says we give until it feels good. God loves a cheerful giver.

homebound, bored, and have nothing to do? Walk down memory lane and reminisce through the years of Immanuel. Please take this



Relay For Life


